AT THE OSCARS

AND THE NOMINEES ARE ...

NEWBIES » This year, nearly half of the acting nominees are vying for the biggest awards for the first time: Steve Carell, Benedict Cumberbatch, Michael Keaton, Eddie Redmayne, J.K. Simmons, Felicity Jones, Rosamund Pike, Patricia Arquette and Emma Stone. Four nominees are previous winners: Robert Duvall, Marion Cotillard, Reese Witherspoon and Meryl Streep.

MOST NOMINATED » Streep extends her lead as the most nominated actor with her 19th nod for "Into the Woods."

BOND GIRLS GET A NOD » Rosamund Pike becomes the third former Bond girl to be nominated. Both her predecessors won: Halle Berry for "Monsters Ball" in 2002 and Kim Basinger for "L.A. Confidential" in 1998.

DOUBLE DUTY » Edward Norton is in two of the best picture nominees — "Birdman" and "The Grand Budapest Hotel" — and has a best supporting actor nod for the former.

AT THE BOX OFFICE

BRINGING IN THE BUCKS » Since 1978, there have been three films -"Titanic" (\$600.8 million; 1997); "Lord of the Rings: Return of the King" (\$377 million; 2003); Forrest Gump (\$329.7 million; 1994) to win best pic and gross more than \$300 million in the U.S.

BOX OFFICE BOMB » "The Hurt Locker" grossed \$17.9 million, the lowest total of any best picture winner since 1978.

FASHIONABLY LATE » Twentynine of the most recent 36 best picture winners were released in theaters after Labor Day.

BUT NOT TOO LATE » This year, six of the eight best picture nominees were released after Labor Day. "The Grand Budapest Hotel" (released March 7) and "Boyhood" (July 11) are the exceptions.

TUNING IN

MOST WATCHED » The mostwatched Oscars telecast was in 1998, which averaged 55.25 million viewers. "Titanic" won for best picture, and Billy Crystal was the host.

LEAST WATCHED » The leastwatched telecast (since 1974) was in 2008 with 32 million viewers. "No Country for Old Men" won, and Jon Stewart was the host.

MASTER OF CEREMONIES » Bob Hope has hosted the show the most at 19 times.

TAKE A SEAT » There are more than 300 seat fillers.

HOLLYWOOD'S GOLDEN NIGHT

he Academy Awards has a bit of a challenge tonight. • It needs to entice and keep an audience because its list of nominated films is light on mainstream hits — "American Sniper" is the only best picture nominee to generate more than \$100 million at the domestic box office. • To draw a broad audience, the awards are relying on a glittery group of presenters and performers including performances by Lady Gaga; Common and John Legend; Adam Levine with Maroon 5; and Tim McGraw. • Ben Affleck, Chris Pratt, Jennifer Aniston, Eddie Murphy, Cate Blanchett and John Travolta will be among presenters.
