onight's Mega Millions jackpot is an all-time world record, the Pennsylvania Lottery announced Monday. At the time of the announcement, the jackpot stood at \$1.6 billion. Wondering how you would even begin to spend some of the winnings? Here are few ideas to get you started:

FLY IN STYLE: A flight on Etihad Airways' Residence will set you back \$64,000. That will get you, among other things, a butler, a double bed, a 32-inch flat-screen TV and breakfast in bed.



\$2.9M

MOST EXPENSIVE CAR ON THE MARKET:

\$2.9 million for an 8.0-liter, 16-cylinder, gas-guzzling Bugatti Chiron that can take you from 0 to 60 in 2.3 seconds. You could buy approximately 311 of these speed machines if you took the cash option.

WORLD RECORD: The \$1.6 billion jackpot is an all-time world record, state lottery officials said Monday. That number will grow as more people purchase tickets before tonight's drawing.

TAKE THE CASH:

As of Monday night, the cash option was \$904.9M. All lottery prizes are taxable income under deferral and state laws.

DOG-LOVERS: The Tibetan Mastiff can sell for up to \$3,500. These dogs can live up to 14 years and can grow to 28 inches and weigh up to 170 pounds.

CAT-LOVERS: Bengals can sell for up to \$1,500. They can live up to 16 years. Male Bengals can top out at 18 pounds, while females can weigh as much as 12 pounds.

\$6.5M PHONE: The Diamond Rose iPhone 32 GB has a price tag approaching \$6.5 million. The phone has 500 smaller diamonds to accent a single 7.5-carat pink diamond. You might want to pony up for that AppleCare protection plan.



Not surprisingly, the most Mega Millions jackpot winners in the past five years have come from states with the largest populations. New York leads with seven winners, while the nation's mostpopulous state, California, is in second place with six winners. Illinois has had four winners.
